A message from Timon Bondo

Greetings from RCPUSA!

This is a very special year for us – we are celebrating our 20th anniversary of service to the people of Rabondo community and beyond. Our 20th Anniversary newsletter gives an overview of our work and achievements. Rabondo is a relatively small subsistent farming community, in Migori county southwest of Kenya, in a largely rural area, distant from major centers.



It is indeed exciting to look back to the state of affairs obtained in the Rabondo community since 1996. When I visited in 1996, I found a community that was in despair, lacking basic services such as education, health care, electricity, safe water, and sanitation. There were no viable roads for motorized vehicles. People were hit hard by the onslaught of HIV/AIDS in an alarming way. People of productive age were affected by this disease, and many children were left orphans and at times had to fend for themselves. The only school had crumbled and was scheduled to be closed by the government.

Twenty years later, the community is dramatically changed because of the action we took. In order to "repair" the community, Rabondo Community Project USA (RCPUSA) was founded as a non-profit to mobilize resources to meet these challenges. These problems were so many, it was hard to focus on just a single one — though we started with constructing a primary school which was built in 1999. Prior to reviving the school and building classrooms, children were having classes outdoors at the whim of the weather and harsh conditions such as rain, wind, dust, and other disruptions.

Educational Opportunities

RCPUSA focused its initial efforts to providing education to the children of Rabondo as a way to encourage the young and empower the community as a whole. I believed that education would help prevent HIV/AIDs infection that was then prevalent in the community. After building a primary school, children could attend classes in an actual classroom as opposed to the outdoors as they had been having for quite some time. The students would be taught how the disease was transmitted, how to respect themselves and to plan for their future. The school would offer a place to focus on studies and help children getting into the mindset of learning.



One way we promote education for girls is by providing sanitary products so they can stay in school all month long. Your ongoing donations keep this program going and these girls in school.

In Kenya most secondary schools are boarding schools. These boarding schools were expensive, and the children of Rabondo could not afford them. We then decided to construct a day secondary school in the community to absorb the children graduating from the primary school. We raised money to build a day secondary school where children could attend school from their homes. In January 2003, a brand new day secondary school was opened at Rabondo with 140 students enrolled.

This school was named St. Timon's Rabondo Secondary Day School, and has an enrollment of 386 students today. Including this year's graduating class of 89 students, since its inception some 765 boys and girls have received diplomas. The reputation of the school draws applicants from beyond the local community. Many graduates have become plumbers, carpenters, and electricians, while others acquired college degrees and are employed as teachers, engineers, accountants, social workers, finance officers, police officers, Information Technology professionals and medical practitioners. Many hold jobs outside of the community. Before, the community did not see the value of girl's education. St. Timon's School admits both boys and girls, giving students (boys and girls) equal opportunity to pursue an education.

Safe Water

Bringing safe water to the Rabondo community has been a major achievement. Drilling of the more than 300-foot-deep well, near the secondary school, was completed in 2010. Prior to this, students at the school would waste learning time walking for miles in order to fetch water. The well supplies safe water and serves the three RCPUSA affiliated institutions – primary school, high school and the health clinic. This has helped us overcome water bone diseases which had been a menace in the area. It also makes clean water available to members of the community. Our goal is to build a water tower that will connect water to where it is needed such as the primary school, medical clinic, and several distribution points within the schools and water kiosks for residents of the community. Connected with this is the need to construct a viable source of power. Currently we rely on public electricity, which is intermittent and sometimes disappears for around a week, and we need a solar powered system.





Health Care

In 2006, RCPUSA decided to improve health access to the community by building a new facility with a provision for a maternity ward. Though small, it is the only health facility that caters not only to the students but also to residents of the community and the surrounding area. Despite its size the clinic has been instrumental in bringing medical care to the community. Its maternity section is especially effective in saving the lives of mothers and children. RCPUSA's goal is to upgrade the dispensary to a larger public health center, which will require more support.



Impact

The building of the schools, clinic, and bringing water and electricity to the community has spawned many businesses within the vicinity and transformed the economy of Rabondo. The area around the Rabondo campus now boasts of many shops that provide products and services to the villagers. The RCPUSA affiliated institutions provide direct employment to teachers, carpenters, cooks, masons, electricians, plumbers, nurses, roofers, and security guards, to name a few. These workers end up spending the money earned from their employment to empower the community, thus generating direct and indirect employment to others such as small farmers.



Our Mission

"Our mission is to empower the community through education and cooperative efforts. I am very pleased that the efforts of RCPUSA has created hope where there was despair. Everyone recognizes that the character of the community has changed. People feel proud to be from Rabondo. Our efforts have harnessed the power of community and volunteerism. In particular, I'm glad I found it a responsibility not to turn my back on Rabondo after my visit in 1996."
